Guidelines and procedure for running the Sunday Worship Service



Elements of a dynamic Church

Core factors:

- The pulpit is dynamic. Preaching is balanced. The service is inspiring. There is good "flow".
- There is effective discipleship programme.
- There is consistent emphasis on victorious living. No sin or hypocrisy in members and/or leaders.
- Members are led to personal commitment to the Lord, His body and His work. Challenging environment for growth, and service.
- Activities are meaningful. There is spiritual content. There is focus both on members and on outreach.

Contributory factors:

- Necessary care and personal attention.
- Respect for members; sensitivity to their needs.
- Attractive church infrastructure (neighbourhood, facilities, childcare, distance, service time, transport, etc).
- Discipline in time management and keeping appointments.



Code of conduct for ministers

* Authority:

- Your authority comes from heaven. Ensure heaven approves of your lifestyle. Be holy. Be blameless.
- Prepare yourself in prayer. You will determine the spiritual atmosphere during your ministration.
- Know your subject; acquire required skill for your part.

Appearance:

- Be decent in your dressing, hairdo, etc. Be neat, presentable.
- Do not dress traditionally to minister. This is peculiar to us as a missionary Church. Be culturally aware.

Attitude:

- Be sober. Use appropriate (non-vulgar) language.
- Respect the people. Let your language be polite and courteous. Learn to say "please", "kindly", "thank you", etc.
- Let your speech be encouraging and conciliatory. Affirm and appreciate every contribution even if you will still correct.



The order of service

"Let all things be done decently and in order." – I Corinthians 14:40



Purpose for an order (I Corinthians 11:40)

- The order of service is an agreement of sequence of events in the house of God as we come to worship.
- An order is necessary to ensure we do all we need to do within the time available.
- An order avoids confusion as we allocate time and sequence to all events.
- An order makes preparation meaningful.
- * An order improves the flow of the service.



Pattern of the order

Service leadership and conduct

* Leadership

- A service coordinator should be appointed for each Sunday, who
 - » Handles the opening prayer, intercession, announcement, offering, newcomers, etc, presides over the Bible Reading, and closes the service with prayer if necessary.
 - » Ensures the infrastructure (PA system, equipment for Bible Reading and, if applicable, the system for showing GS' message) functions properly.
- The coordinator shall be exempted from other activities (except STS teaching) during the service for as much as practicable.
- The pastor (in most cases) or his delegate announces the congregational songs, takes the summary and the sermon.
- A chorister leads the song from a place outside the pulpit.

Conduct

- The service should be solemn. There should be no trifling.
- Walking around should be highly discouraged during the service.
 Leaders should show example.
- Children (up to JSS) are not allowed to take offering or officiate.
 Other children who offciate must be born again just like adults.



Precision in the order

"And look that thou make them after their pattern, which was shewed the in the mount." – Exodus 25:40.



Opening prayer

- The form:
 - The objective is to commence the service in a solemn way.
 - · One or two worship songs should be enough, not compulsory
- Mandatory prayer points:
 - Thanksgiving and worship
 - Praying for the abiding presence and power of the Lord
 - Removing every obstacle from the way
 - Praying for newcomers
 - Praying for the ministers and their ministration
 - Praying for the children ministry
 - Praying for the needy that God will meet their needs
 - Personal needs for the day
- Note: Do not make it a demon-chasing session! Make people more conscious of God's power and presence.



Search the Scriptures

This should be a time for high interaction. Goal is to pass knowledge to people through participation.

The structure:

- Spend the first 5 minutes to read the text and make connection to the previous study.
- Then spend the 5 minutes to summarise the study.
- Then spend 10 minutes on the body by asking questions in a way to involve as many people as possible, passing short comments where necessary.
- Conclude.
- Let people pray on the subject for at least 5 minutes.

Scriptures:

- The people should read as much Bible as possible
- Timing: keep the timing to 25 minutes.



The summary

- Summary should complement and clarify the teaching
- * Ask how many people have questions.
- Take all questions at a time to save time and enable some grouping.
- Answer questions precisely and concisely. If you do not know the answer, defer it. Keep to the Bible!
- Do not redo the study; rather summarise and conclude it with a main point.
- Let the people pray.



Intercession, offering, etc

Points for intercession:

- People's needs, the nation, our sister Churches, missions, etc.
- Leaders, starting with General Superintendent, then the European and/or National Overseer, Pastors and Workers.
- The message of the day, the children ministry and the interpretation.
- Specific or special programmes.
- Offering: ask people to lift up their offering and pray. Do not make a show of it (like singing, playing keyboard, etc).

Announcement

- Be specific and concise.
- Avoid making it a preaching time; refer people to the bulletin.

Newcomers:

- This is what comes last. Ensure they have your attention.
- Let each newcomer introduce him- or herself.
- Greet them and appreciate them; give them the first-timer's card.
- Let the church welcome them and pray for them.
- Ensure they are cared for at the end of the service.



Worship, cong song / choir

- Make the worship inspiring:
 - Be filled with the Spirit.
 - Do not be dull; lead the people to express themselves to God.
 - Let there be a mix of worship songs and choruses. Be contemporary in your songs and clapping!
 - Avoid rowdiness. Let things be done in order.
- Sing the cong song or choir piece:
 - Let the song be led by someone who can sing very well and also knows the song. This is not necessarily the minister!
 - Precision in singing is essential. Keep to the tune and rhythm.
 - Let the Spirit modulate the session.
 - Do not sing vernacular songs (Yoruba, Twi, Ibo, etc)!
- Key point to consider:
 - Pastor should ensure the singers are properly dressed. Open chest, high heels, short skirts, curled hair, etc, are not consistent with vigilance and sobriety!



The message

The content:

- The outline is provided; that is your message for the day.
- Seek to understand the subject and make it your own.
- Do not digress from the content; there is enough freedom in the delivery.

The delivery:

- Be presentable. Simple and smart dressing is key. Be neat.
- Be soaked in prayer; be filled with the Spirit.
- Speak clearly and at a steady pace.
- Maintain eye contact. Speak to everyone.
- Keep to the subject and make progress.
- Do not over-illustrate; keep it simple.
- Refrain from entertainment; preach the Word!
- Be positive and motivating. Give the people hope!
- Be conclusive and let the people pray well.
