## DEEPER LIFE BIBLE CHURCH NL | SUNDAY SERMON | 19 JANUARY 2025 GOD IS! Isaiah 45:22; Hebrews 11:6; Psalm 46:10

## BIBLE READING: Acts 17:22-30

Who is God? How did He come into existence? Who created Him? Is God real? These are questions people have been asking. Some ask from a sincere heart, others to mock God's existence. Notwithstanding, having the right perspective about God is of utmost importance because a false idea about God leads to idolatry and damnation; and can make one not to enjoy God's best in life. God reproves the wicked man with this accusation: "*thou thoughtest that I was altogether such an one as thyself*:" (Psalm 50:21). How then can we know that God exists?

## 1. INSIGHTS INTO GOD'S EXISTENCE

We may not know God's origin, but the fact of God's existence is obvious, through creation, man's conscience, and what God says about Himself (Romans 1:20; Isaiah 45:22). Man is born with *consciousness* of a supreme being (Acts 17:22, 23). But the Bible reveals that God created man in His own image - as a God-conscious being (Genesis 1:27; 2:7). That's why the Bible calls the atheist a "fool" (Psalm 14:1). The existence of God is also *logical*. Everything has a cause, just as a house has a builder (Hebrews 3:4). So also do the heavens, seasons, languages, and patterns and order of creation, point to a Supreme Creator (Psalm 19:1-3, Acts 17:24-30). Through creation God proves His existence unto man, *"for the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse."* (Romans 1:18-21). Moreover, testimonies abound of God's divine intervention in the affairs of man. These are real and prevalent, and unbiased minds can relate to such (Psalm 34:8). The Bible reveals the nature, character, and works of God. *By nature, God* is Spirit (John 4:24). He is infinite (1 Timothy 1:17), incomparable (2 Samuel 7:22), and unchanging (Malachi 3:6). By *character,* God is holy (Leviticus 11:44; Psalm 99:9), loving (Ephesians 2:4-5; John 3:16), truthful (John 14:6), just (Acts 17:31); gracious (Romans 5:17; Exodus 34:6), judges sin (Psalm 5:5) but also offers forgiveness to the penitent (Psalm 130:4; Isaiah 55:7).

## 2. IMPLICATIONS OF GOD'S EXISTENCE

Why is it necessary to acknowledge and understand that God exists? **One**, accountability. *So, then every one of us shall give account of himself to God* (Romans 14:12). What we do matters. When we believe that God exists, we can receive His blessings (Hebrews 11:2). Unbelief has its repercussions (Hebrews 3:12, 19). There is also a reward for righteousness and punishment for unrighteousness. Sin and holiness are now defined and meaningful. Eternity makes sense. **Two**, *security*. Since God exists, we can relate to Him and dwell under His shadow (Psalm 91:1,2; 46:1,2; Proverbs 18:10). Things no longer are arbitrary. We now know that there is Someone we can lean on (Malachi 3:6). Prayer becomes meaningful (Jeremiah 33:3; Isaiah 45:22). It is logical then to expect miracles. **Three**, faith. The role of faith is central in understanding God and His creation (Hebrews 11:1-3). *"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him" (Hebrews 11:6).* To experience that God is real, faith is required. Faith in not a feeling or an abstract expectation. Faith in God is the trust in Him, based on a true understanding of who He is, as revealed in the Bible (Genesis 15:5; Hebrews 6:17,18). Faith in God involves an intellectual assent to the facts concerning God and a life-changing reliance on those facts. God has made Himself known through His word. Whatever the Bible says is believable and verifiable (Romans 15:4; 2 Timothy 3:16).

God seeks to have relationship with mankind. The Son of God became the Son of Man and is therefore the "bridge" between God and man (John 1:14; 14:6; 1 Timothy 2:5). It is only through the Son that we can have forgiveness of sins (Ephesians 1:7), reconciliation with God (John 15:15; Romans 5:10), and eternal salvation (2 Timothy 2:10). In Jesus Christ "*dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily*" (Colossians 2:9). So, to really know who God is, we must look to Jesus, have the Spirit of God abide in us (1 Corinthians 2:10), and daily study His Word (Hebrews 4:12).
